### SCHOOL NEWS

The Kelley Island Public Schools  
opened on September 2, with the fol-  
lowing teachers in charge: W. E.  
Parks, Superintendent; Oscar A.  
Kivaly, Principal; Mrs. Viva Schlich-  
ter, seventh and eighth grades; Ruth

Reinheimer, fifth and sixth grades;  
Margaret Perkinson, third and fourth  
grades; and Kathleen Bell, first and  
second grades.

We have enrolled to date, eleventh  
grade, 7; tenth grade, 9; ninth grade,  
15; eighth grade, 9; seventh grade,  
11, sixth grade, 25; fifth grade, 14;  
fourth grade, 19; third grade, 13;  
second grade, 12; first grade, 22.

Kelleys Island is the largest in the  
group belonging to the United States  
is located in Latitude 41° 35' North  
and in Longitude 82° 42' West from  
Greenwich. It is situated in Lake Erie  
ten miles north of Sandusky in Erie  
County, and about eight miles south-  
east of Put-in-Bay where Commodore  
Perry's famous battle of Lake Erie  
was fought. It is nearly six hundred  
feet above sea level and contains  
2,888 acres. It was first known as  
Island Number Six, then as Cunning-  
ham's Island. In 1833, it was pur-  
chased by Datus and Irad Kelley from  
whom it took its present name.
