SCHOOL NEWS

The Kelley Island Public Schools opened on September 2, with the following teachers in charge: W. E. Parks, Superintendent; Oscar A. We have enrolled to date, eleventh grade, 7; tenth grade, 9; ninth grade, 15; eighth grade, 9; seventh grade, 11, sixth grade, 25; fifth grade, 14; fourth grade, 19; third grade, 19; second grade, 12; first grade, 22.

Kelleys Island is the largest in the group belonging to the United States is located in Latitude 41° 35' North and in Longitude 82" 42' West from Greenwich. It is situated in Lake Eris ten miles north of Sandusky in Eris County, and about eight miles southeast of Put-in-Bay where Commodore Perry's famous battle of Lake Erie was fought. It is nearly six hundred feet above sea level and contains 2,888 acres. It was first known as Island Number Six, then as Cunningham's Island.
