





The Erie County Community Health Center recently opened its new doors to the public in the old Golias house at 117 Addison Street. Dental services became available in May 2023. This resident needed a dentist, so I called the number on the window sign at the KI location (567-867-5174) and easily made an appointment.

Friday at about 10:45am with my 3.5-year-old grandson in tow, I arrived at the office. The new parking lot is attractive, and signage points you to a back door entrance of the house. Coming out of the house as I was going in, was fellow islander Denise Randazzo. After a friendly hello and a child conversation with the 3-year-old, Denise was on her way. I entered the bright, welcoming white interior and

I was welcomed by Jacque Blodgett (clerical organizer) and Shelley Wicker, RN, in the patient waiting area/Clerical space. I introduced myself as a writer for Life On Kelleys but also as a patient with a dentist appointment. They were expecting me in both roles.

All the staff are employed by The Erie County Health Center and Health Department. There are three rotating dentists: Dr. Kunal Kanani, Dr. Megha Kanani, and Dr. Sami Mubarak. I had the pleasure of meeting Dr. Kunal Kanani. He and his wife (Dr. Megha Kanani) are both employed by Erie County. They both had 10 years of practice in Connecticut. They had an interest in Community Health, saw this opportunity and after exploring the area and interviewing, accepted the positions with the county.

Alexis Cook expertly performs her role as Dental Assistant. She is supervised by Jessica Camera. The physician staff includes Roberto (Rob) Gonzales, NP-C and Dr. Timothy Plank, DO.

The services offered at the Health Center include, Primary Care, Pediatrics, Immunizations, General Dentistry, and Medication-Assisted Treatment. After filling out the typical paperwork and being helped to do so by Jacque I was ready for the dental chair. My grandson had beat me to the chair and was being entertained by Assistant Alexis. Her friendliness and introduction of all things in the dental chair to him will certainly aid in his first trips to the dentist! Thank you, Alexis! X-rays were next so the grandson left the room with nurse Shelley and could be heard being entertained until x-rays were complete and he could come back to watch the rest of the dental process. Are You Taking Too Many Medications?

In May 2023, I interviewed Dr. Ardeshir Hashmi, Cleveland Clinic Chair of Geriatric Endowed Innovation. We discussed what older people ought to know when taking multiple drugs to treat a variety of diseases and other health problems.

According to the National Institutes of Health, Polypharmacy is defined as the regular use of at least five or more medications. Today, it is common to see patients taking 10 or more medications per day. Hashmi said, "Prescribing multiple medications has regrettably become the norm.'

Although each medication is studied for side effects individually,

what most people don't know is prescription drugs are not studied for side-effects when taken in combination with a variety of other medications. "We don't know what side-effects take place under all circumstances.²

There is something known as the Prescribing Cascade. To explain it, Hashmi gave this example. "A patient goes to their doctor because they feel their heart racing. The doctor prescribes a medication and it fixes the racing heart. At the follow up appointment, the patient tells the doctor the heart racing is fixed, but now the patient complains of feeling tired and depressed. The doctor prescribes an anti-depressant. The

patient returns and reports he/she is feeling somewhat less depressed, but now has less of an appetite. The doctor then prescribes another antidepressant and a vitamin to stimulate appetite.

What is actually happening is the patient is experiencing consecutive side effects from each newly prescribed medication. As opposed to recognizing that the successive symptoms being reported are actually medication side effects warranting "deprescribing", the clinician instead erroneously starts new medications for each reported symptom leading to even more side effects and

so on...

His advice to patients, who want

to work with their doctor to treat their health problems, while minimizing side effects, is always ask their doctor:

1. What are the common side effects with this drug?

2. If I feel anything different, after taking this medication, I'm going to call you so we can discuss it.

Is that OK with you?

3. Are there any alternatives to medications to treat the symptom / condition I am having?

"By communicating in this way, the patient is saying, 'I trust you, but this is my body. I am in control of this.'" He went on to say, "There is no substitute for self-advocacy."

Geriatricians are specially trained in de-prescribing medications, which are not appropriate for advanced age. Geriatricians will work with a geriatric pharmacist to make recommended changes. However, geriatricians will not change a medication regimen without bringing the primary care physician and the patient on board with the medication plan. If you are on more than five medications, it is recommended that an older patient have a geriatric drug review one time per year.


Kelleys Island Schools Field Station

So as you see someone drive by, you give a friendly wave,


they are someone you know, or perhaps you soon will.


If you leave the island you will sense there is something missing, you will miss the sense of being or being

Erie County Community Foundation and Firelands Forward Partner with Three Local Nonprofits to Assist Residents Displaced by Sale Of Oster's Mobile Home Park

Sandusky, Ohio, June 22, 2023 — Erie County Community Foundation and Firelands Forward are teaming up with three area nonprofits to assist local Erie County residents unexpectedly evicted from Oster's Mobile Home Park in Huron. For the past five years, Canopy Tuesday, Salvation Army - Huron Service Unit, and Huron St. Vincent de Paul Society have been the primary advocates for displaced residents, providing social and financial resources relative to their dealings with the city.

The City of Huron recently purchased the park and intends to repurpose it from a mobile home park to an unknown future use. The nonprofits are currently working with Oster Mobile Home Park residents to assist them with the expenses of moving and finding new housing.

"It is going to be a struggle for these residents to find new homes," said David White, Director of Firelands Forward. "Erie County already has a rental housing gap of over 1,600 units, primarily for units having rents under \$1,700 per month. Firelands Forward is using our Employer Resource Network to case manage these residents and their families to help them negotiate their immediate and future needs."

Community members wishing to donate to help these residents offset their unexpected expenses can visit https://www.eriefoundation.org/ and click on the Oster/Rye Beach Assistance Fund button on the home page.

Erie County Community Foundation is collecting and managing money donated to the fund for distribution directly to the residents through Firelands Forward. Donations are tax deductible per IRS regulations. Only monetary donations can be accepted – no "in-kind donations" are permitted. Donors can process credit card donations directly through the Erie County Community Foundation website, or mail or drop off checks to the Foundation's office at 135 E. Washington Row in Sandusky.

"All funds donated will go toward moving, storage, rent assistance, and other expenses these displaced residents incur," said Roxanne Goss from Salvation Army - Huron Service Unit. "The limited housing options here make this exceptionally difficult. Nearly three months since the purchase, and after continuous search for new homes, only a handful of Oster residents have been able to find adequate housing."


