The American Council of Engineering Companies of Ohio announced their Engineering Excellence Awards for 2024, selecting the Kelleys Island Glacial Grooves project in Kelleys Island, Ohio for an Honor Award.

The Glacial Grooves Erosion Protection and Site Improvement project safeguards a National Natural Landmark from continuing erosion and degradation for future generations while delivering an immersive barrier-free viewing experience at this popular tourist attraction. Because of their large size and accessibility, the glacial grooves are arguably the most famous in the world and a critical feature to local residents, visitors, historians, scientists, and students alike. This geologic feature provides valuable

information about the movement of the glaciers that shaped the landscape of the Great Lakes region.

The grooves have been exposed to weathering and erosion since fully excavated in 1972, with the original stairs, bridges, and perimeter fencing functioning for decades. Permanent protective measures were needed to address rock weathering, vegetation encroachment, surface water and seepage, and erosion. Site improvements were desired to replace aging infrastructure, improve site access, and provide better safety for visitors.

The project team sought to integrate engineering solutions into the overall site

Thanks for the memories, Big Chuck

On Sunday, January 19, 2025 at the age of 90, legend "Big Chuck" Schodowski passed away leaving many of us with fond memories of his role in sketches such as: "The Kielbasa Kid," (in which he played a bumbling cowboy), "Cuyahoga Jones" (a take-off of Indiana Jones) and "The Certain Ethnic", which he created as a loving homage to his Polish heritage.

He began his career behind the camera, as a technician, in 1960 when he moved from KYW-TV (now WKYC) to WJW-TV (Channel 8). Schodowski loved his editing skills even though he worked his way up as an official Director of WJW where he maintained his celebrity status.

Many celebrities were seen on the show including Andy Griffith, Muhammad Ali, Tim Conway and Drew Carey.

Although Schodowski maintained a home in Hinckley, Ohio, he also made Kelleys Island his home away from home. In 1965 he came to Kelleys Island with his young family even though he had never heard of it and had never even known there were islands in Lake Erie!

Chuck and his wife, June spent a lot of time on the Island along with their five grown



children and 14 grandchildren. After he retired, he had more time to spend with his family at the summer retreat which was a parcel with two homes, one of them a cottage that was once a Sohio gas station, built in the 1920s.

There will only be one "Big Chuck" and we'll miss him. Thanks for all you gave us.

From the Mayor's Desk

Wow, it has been a busy, cold winter and I'm sure glad it is over. I would like to get you caught up on a couple of items that have been happening this winter.

First, much gratitude goes out to those that have worked very hard on the Transient Rental legislation, especially Sue Taylor, our Transient Rental clerk. She has spent many hours sorting, understanding and putting together all the information received, putting it in order to have it on our village website. She has answered many questions and will continue to do so. On the same topic, I was in Columbus at the State House to testify in opposition of Senate Bill 104. This bill was introduced to limit municipalities control of B&Bs, and Short-Term rentals. I believe residents rightfully expect their local governments to maintain a level of control over zoning and land use matters, including the regulation of short-term rentals. Stripping municipalities of this authority would undermine their ability to protect neighborhoods and preserve the character of their communities. While in Columbus, I met with Senator Gavarone on this and other matters. She has been tremendous help to us and all northwestern Ohio.

Secondly, KEM, the engineering firm doing the design and planning stage of our Sanitary Sewer system, has completed the surveying and is now moving on to the next phase, soil boring. KEM and the village have had several meetings with Ohio EPA and we are looking for funding help from them. I can't thank enough our Lobbyist, Nathanael Johnhenry, legislators Rep DJ Swearingen and Senator Gavarone for funding and their constant support in our endeavors.

Finally, there will be some road paving projects to contend with later this summer and fall which will be including Fairview and Lake Court. That is it for Village news currently, so enjoy hopefully an early summer.

The Kelleys Island Historical Association: Since 1980

The Kelleys Island Historical Association (KIHA) was formed in 1980 with the primary objective of purchasing the Old Stone Church. The Church was vacated in 1956 and suffered from neglect and deterioration.

The Historic church became the property of the Historical Association in 1986. Repairs, restoration, and maintenance have been ongoing. The Parsonage House and its outhouse building were also acquired at that time. The Church initially served as a gift shop with a few displays of the history of the island. As more items were donated, the need for a new museum was obvious. In June 2010, The Association opened the doors to the new Museum which stands at the location of the 'haul shed' that was used to house the horses and buggies while parishioners attended services. It was not until 2017 that the Parsonage House was opened to the public. It began as a small resale shop selling items displayed primarily in the front room and dining area. The rest of the house had been cleaned by volunteers, for the public to view. The Resale business grew and grew, until in the fall of 2022 a new building was erected on

campus called, "Sis's Cottage." The building was aptly and fondly named after Florence (nee Betzenhiemer), who was the last occupant of the home.

Memberships help fund The Museum Campus buildings and mission. Large fundraisers have been held to raise substantial amounts of money needed for the Association to maintain the historic buildings and its ever-growing museum collections. With the success of the business, "The Parsonage House and Sis's Cottage Resale Shop," the Association has not held a major fundraiser in a few years. This year, 2025, a major fundraiser has begun! Kelleys Island Historical Association's "Free" Ride Fundraiser. With only 500 tickets being sold, the winner will get a \$500.00 gift card to the

elements, envisioning an opportunity to extend beyond protecting and preserving the feature.

Project Impact

This project implemented measures to protect and preserve the grooves, to reduce erosion, and to enhance visitor experience and safety. The elevated pedestrian bridge walkway and custom railing system facilitate an immersive visual experience, while the integrated stormwater management system directs runoff away from the grooves and protects the underlying fractured rock from erosion and groundwater infiltration.

The custom pedestrian bridge incorporates a mid- span forward-looking point to reflect the form of a glacier advancing over the land. At the forward pinnacle, visitors experience the natural history and culture of Kelleys Island, looking west across the historical quarry, and east and down vertically into the grooves.



The site location five miles from the mainland in Lake Erie presented design and construction challenges. The unique logistics meant that all personnel, equipment, and materials were transported via a 40-minute seasonal and weather-dependent ferry boat trip.

The site arrangement, design, and selection of materials sought to minimize the visual impact of the infrastructure while integrating engineering and stormwater management solutions and allowing the visual focus to remain on the glacial grooves and surrounding vistas.

Reflections on the 2024-2025 school year

As the 2024-2025 school year winds down, we reflect on another enriching, successful, and joy-filled year for our students and staff.

Our students ventured beyond the classroom for mainland educational experiences and field trips including visits to the Historic Lyme Village, Spiegel Grove, and Mini Main Street. Students attended a performance of Ellis Island by the Toledo Symphony, as well as a performance of Nord Education Concerts by The Cleveland Orchestra.

One of our most heartwarming achievements was a student-led fundraiser that benefitted the Erie County Humane Society. Students visited the shelter to deliver the donated funds and were able to tour the facility to meet some of the sweet animals the fundraiser would help. Students also volunteered at Victory Kitchen, helping to prepare food that would be served on Thanksgiving.

Within the walls of our beautiful school, students participated in lively classroom discussions, book reports, STEM challenges and more! School Board President Janet Wermuth shared her insight on the unique and beneficial classroom environment at KI school. In a larger school setting instruction is based on the needs of the majority rather than a personal focus. As spring blooms and the weather improves, students will begin having some classroom time in our outdoor classroom space, one of the many new improvements made to the property

this year. Other projects include the revamping of the community garden and the gymnasium renovation project. Wermuth praised the improvements. "The enhancement and improvements to the school's campus this year have been monumental. The work coordinated by Rost Zettler, Maintenance Director, spans the replacement of the emergency generator system to the refurbishing of the school garden... Other plans are being explored as the board works to preserve the school's heritage and improve safety features of the campus for our students and visitors," Wermuth said.

Superintendent Ben Ohlemacher echoed many of the sentiments expressed by Wermuth, demonstrating a deep appreciation to all that contribute to the day-to-day operations of the district. Council Notes

Since the last issue of Life on Kelleys last year, Council has met each month except January and February. The meetings have been relatively short and you can attend remotely via Zoom. The link is on the Village website. The April meeting lasted just 18 minutes with 20 people attending.

The POLICE DEPT. reported that they currently have 6 officers (some in their 4th year on the Island), and 3 in the process of being hired with 2 candidates additional under consideration. They received 5 reports and issued 3 warnings (speeding and stop sign). New cameras will be installed on several Village buildings including the Police station and Kelley's Hall. Our EMS had 3 runs and 6 clinic calls. FIRE DEPT. had no runs (good news) and reported that Ohio has issued a burn ban until the end of

PLANNING COMMISSION will meet on April 24 to consider some code changes. Only 2 Resolutions were passed, both certifying the tax valuation for tax levies which will be on the November ballot.

Chris Kipfer has been appointed

BZA alternate.

Citizen participation included a request that Fairview Lane be repaired or share plans for repaving and concerns about EPA cuts that would affect the Sewer plans and whether the Village was looking at alternate options.

There was a second reading on a raise for the Zoning Inspector (increase to \$27,000), which begs the question of why the Village is increasing the ZI salary when his workload will be substantially reduced due to the City of Sandusky taking over the permit process. The Village is still waiting for the city of Sandusky to formalize the agreement for the 'review of building plans and specifications, and providing building inspection service to establish and maintain building department services for commercial, residential and public buildings in the Village..." This means, any alterations to a building or construction on a lot must meet village requirements. Sandusky will process the permits and do the inspections. Work not done as described in the permit will be halted and the owners fined.

Short Term Rental Legislation Update

It has been a long journey for the Transient Rental program. The original ordinance 2024-0-14 was passed in August. A referendum petition was filed which was ultimately declared invalid and the ordinance was repealed. The new ordinance was changed every time it appeared before Council. KIND (K I Neighborhoods Development) made 'compelling' recommendations (per David Lambros) and Ordinance 2024-O-23 finally passed in November with these changes. The deadline for registering is May 31 and information can be found on the Village website KelleysIsland.us. What is the cost to a Transient Rental property owner? Around \$1000 (\$600 for the yearly

application, \$200 for the Safety Inspection and \$200 for the septic inspection, more if pump out is needed). The two inspections are good for three years. OH SB 104, currently making its way through the legislature, will be dealing with this matter. It is a proposed change to the Ohio Revised Code to limit the authority of local governments to regulate short-term rental properties, to extend local lodging taxes to short-term rentals, to require collection of those taxes by short-term rental platforms. Part of this bill will set limits on costs for the necessary license. https://legiscan. com/OH/bill/SB104/2025. With the late start to the ferry, people are scrambling to get their inspections scheduled.


Join the KI Audubon Club and Discover a Love

On Sunday, May 18, from 7AM until 2PM, the club will host their spring festival "Nest with the Birds" at the Jones Preserve on Long Point. Tom and Paula Bartlett will continue their Avian Study of Birds and educate visitors about the many varieties of songbirds that use the island as a place to rest and refuel as they migrate north

Birdwatching has evolved from a niche hobby into a global pastime enjoyed by millions. What was once reserved for dedicated ornithologists and a small group of enthusiasts has now blossomed into one of the most popular outdoor activities in the world. Indeed, the Lake Erie Islands and northeast Ohio have become a very popular place to witness the spring migration of songbirds, with throngs of people visiting Magee Marsh Wildlife Area and the Black Swamp Nature Center each year. The birding on Kelleys Island is just as exciting, while escaping most of the large crowds at sites on the mainland.

specialized knowledge, field guides, and sometimes, access to remote locations. Today, apps like eBird, which allows birders to log sightings and share data with a global community, and iNaturalist, a platform that connects people to nature, have revolutionized the hobby. Particularly useful is the Cornell Lab of Ornithology app "Merlin", https://merlin.allaboutbirds.org/, which allows users to identify birds by sound when they are observed. These apps not only make it easier to identify and track birds but also foster a sense of community among birders of all skill

Another reason for birding's surge in popularity is the growing awareness of environmental and conservation issues. As concerns over biodiversity loss and climate change increase, many people have turned to bird

watching as a way to reconnect with the natural world and become more conscious of the delicate ecosystems that sustain it. Birds, as indicators of the health of the environment, offer a tangible and accessible way to engage with conservation efforts. Many birders have become advocates for habitat preservation, working with local conservation groups and even participating in citizen science projects to monitor bird populations.


I was calm.



The Titus Road Statue of the Virgin Mary

It seems like every few years, there is a flood of questions about the statue of Mary located on Titus Road. Rumors abound! One person heard it was created in honor of Island fishermen - a fisherman's shrine if you will. Another was sure it was a memorial to a young couple who died in a car accident at the spot on their wedding day. These, and the others, are all quite romantic, but unfortunately, not true.

Several years ago, the best history of the statue appeared in our local newspaper, *Kelleys Life* (the March/April 2012) edition. So, in answer to all those questions, and thanks to *Kelleys Life*, here is the real story about the Statue of Virgin Mary that we all love so well.

The KI Grotto and the Statue of Mary

Did you know Kelleys Island has its very own grotto? The grotto and statue of Mary is situated toward the western end of Tilus Road on the north side of the road. A small path leads to the statue of Mary, housed in a crèche, overlooking a grotto in natural rock. The statue is set back a bit from the road but is easily seen.

Many pass by the area without noticing the statue and others have wondered about it. Yet many others have left mementoes ever since the statue was put in place in 1948. Rosaries, flowers, personal obituaries, memorabilia, photographs, rocks, beach glass and handwritten notes are among the many items left at the grotto. 'Some of the notes are heartbreaking." said Fran Minshall, the owner of the property and statue.

There is a small area where you can park your bikes. golf carts and vehicles to reflect for a moment and enjoy the quiet and beauty of the wooded area. It is especially pretty in the fall when the leaves are donning their fall colors and the solitude is most remarkable.

Fran Minshall reflected on the history of the statue of Mary. According to Fran, her sister-in-

law, Evelyn Minshall (sister of husband William E. Minshall)

successfully located a medieval French Madonia and Baby statue while in France. She brought the statue back from Europe and a carpenter built a creche.

The creche you see today is the original one and has remained in that location since


The area was well maintained with numerous daffodils and ivy planted. "It was lovely. just lovely." Fran reminisced. Fran recalled that sometime around 1970 the statue was found broken. A search of the debris resulted in her finding only the head of the child Jesus. She saved the head and today it is displayed on her fireplace along with a photograph of the original statue. A Good Samaritan, whose name is long forgotten, replaced the French Madonna and Child statue with the statue of Mary that you see today. A subsequent prank resulted in the new statue's temporary disappearance. Once the statue was located, it was promptly returned and has remained in place for over 15 years.

Take a few minutes to enjoy the solitude of Titus Road and the statue. A close look at the postcard


